# School Nevelopment

### PUPIL PARLIAMENT

As an educator, one of by biggest passions has always been empowering children to use their voices for change. This theme now runs through many of the key development priorities for Bradfield, including our overarching curriculum, our 'No Outsiders' status and , I am pleased to say, the development of our Pupil Parliament



Last week I met with our existing Pupil Parliament, which consists of two elected pupils from year I upwards, to discuss the future of the group. I asked the children how they would like to see the Pupil Parliament work and how we might make that a reality moving forward.

During these discussions, we agreed that Pupil Parliament should be a true reflection of democracy, creating real change in our school. Moving forward, democracy at Bradfield will include:

- \*Half termly Pupil Parliament meetings
- \*Minutes of these meetings will be shared with children, staff and parents and uploaded to our website.
- \*Each meeting will pose a key question around the development of the school.
- \*Half termly 'Democracy Time' in classes will give our MPs a chance to feed back and pose questions to their peers.
- \*A Parliament voting board will be displayed in school each half term and will be an interactive way for every child to vote on a key issue that is important to them.
- \*Year 6 MPs will act as representatives and report to governors once every big term.

Our key question for the summer term is 'How Can We Reward Children At Bradfield?' and this has generated some fantastic ideas from the MPs already. They will now be taking this question back to thir classes and will use the Voting Board to genuinely support the design of a new reward system for September.





### LIFE SAVING CPR TRAINING

This week we welcomed Matt from The Paul Alan Project to school to deliver a basic life saving CPR course. Matt will be back with us next month to run the course again for anyone who would like to sign up.

During the 2 hour course, you will learn:

- How to spot the signs of a cardiac arrest
- How to help someone who is having a cardiac arrest
- How to perform CPR
- · How to use a defibrillator
- The difference between a heart attack and a cardiac arrest

Participation costs just £1 per person and all money raised goes back into The Paul Alan Project to continue to fund life-saving training and to fund publicly accessible defibrillators in our community.
