Key Vocabulary

Finger Spaces	The amount of space that needs to be left between words.
Capital Letters	Used as the first letter of a sentence or a proper noun.
Full Stops	A punctuation mark used at the end of a sentence.
Question Marks	A punctuation mark indicating a question.
Exclamation Marks	A punctuation mark indicating an exclamation.
Noun	A person, place, or thing.
Adjective	A describing word.

Challenge!

To become an expert at using adjectives, try using one before each noun you use in your writing. Try and make it as interesting as possible to! Using an adjective can give the reader more information about what something looks like, sounds like, feels like and smells like.

The cat went to bed.

Now that is a bit boring isn't it. Let's try again...

The fluffy cat went to bed.
The fluffy, ginger cat went to bed.
The fluffy, ginger cat went into her soft bed.
The fluffy, ginger cat went into her soft, squeaky bed.

Now that's better!

How words can join together to make sentences.

Tom likes chocolate.

Joining words and clauses using *and*

Tom likes chocolate and he has a blue hat.

Suffixes

Regular plural noun suffixes -s or -es.

If a word ends in 'sh' 'ch' 'x' 's' or 'z', you add -es. Anything else, it's just s you need to add.
